## SAMS Ministry

Dear friends,

We have a special request of all of you! As we mentioned in our previous prayer request e-mail, we need to return to the US in June for a few months in order to raise more support for our ministry here in Peru. We will be visiting many of the churches and individuals who currently support us to update them on all God has done and ask for their continued help. Making these visits will require us to travel to several different regions (namely to Texas, NC, WI, PA and VA), and with a family of 4 the cost of buying plane tickets is high. We will be driving ourselves whenever we can to save money, but at several points the distances are too long and the timing too short to travel any way but by plane. For this reason, if any of you have extra air miles you are not planning to use that you would be willing to give to us it would be extremely helpful and important. Please let us know if this is a possibility so that we can make arrangements with you!

Specifically:

- We need 62,500 AAdvantage miles per person to complete all five internal flights.
- It is possible to donate up to 15,000 miles per person/per year to our four individual airmile accounts. This would enable us to purchase our tickets with airmiles, at 12,500 per flight, per person.
- It is also possible to purchase outright a ticket on our behalf, using our reservation code. This option also requires the person buying the ticket with their miles to pay for the additional taxes on their own credit card.
- Even if you can give us a smaller amount of miles, hopefully these will add up to cover what we need.

## Uganda Christian University

On May 13 the Chancellor of Uganda Christian University, Bishop Henry Orombi, announced the appointment of a new Vice Chancellor for the University. The announcement came seven months after an intensive local, regional and international search process. The university's new Vice Chancellor is The Rev. Dr. John Senyoni, age 54, who had been serving as Deputy Vice Chancellor of the University.



Dr. Senyoni is the successor to Truro's good friend (and former Associate Rector) Dr. Stephen Noll, who commented last week, I am very glad to hear that Dr. John Senyoni has been appointed to succeed me as Vice Chancellor. John has worked with me in several capacities over the past ten years, and I am convinced he will continue to lead the University in a direction that will honour God as Alpha and Omega and promote academic excellence for all.

Prof. Noll will continue as Vice Chancellor working with Dr. Senyoni through the transition. He will hand over his responsibilities on August 31, 2010. Uganda Christian University (UCU) was established in 1997.

## A Call to Truro to Pray & Fast

We expect we may have a ruling from the Supreme Court on Friday, June 11th (although this is subject to change). You are encouraged, as you are able, to fast at least one meal every Thursday and intercede in prayer. To help guide your prayers, here is a prayer that I will be using in my prayer time:

***O Lord Jesus Christ, who built your Church upon the rock of the Apostles, that even the gates of hell cannot prevail against it: Be merciful to the churches of this land, give us the grace of repentance so that our hearts turn to you alone, and especially we pray for our own Church, Truro Parish, that we would have a single heart for You. Make our worship pleasing to your sight, sweeten our fellowship with tender hearts toward one another, unite us in a common vision and purpose, grant us favor in the deliberations of the Virginia Supreme Court, and most of all, make us instruments of your peace and truth in a country in need of a revival of goodness and light. We ask this in Jesus Name. Amen.***

## Anglican Insights Series featuring Os Guinness

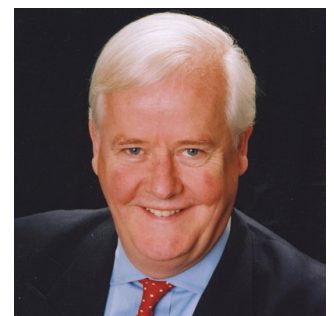
