Vestry Highlights

The Vestry opened its May 25th meeting with worship, prayer and a meditation from the book that the Vestry will be reading this year "Same Kind of Different As Me". At its Annual Meeting held before the Parish Retreat at Canaan Valley, the Vestry elected the following officers: Sr. Warden-Steve Springmann, Jr. Warden-Bill Bixler and Register-Leslie Murphy. At this meeting, Phil Dame was elected Treasurer.

The Vestry heard a report on the contingency planning being done to provide for Truro's operations in the event Truro loses its facilities and had an extended discussion of the process involved in planning and implementing a new governance model. The Vestry has appointed a Task Force to provide a model for Vestry relational behavior to which it can aspire that would assure grace and thoughtfulness in our interactions that we might bring God glory. We hope to model this behavior in all of our relationships throughout our Truro Community.



Treasurer's Report: April contributions were \$301,129 and year to date ('YTD') pledge income is \$1,112,412 or 2.3% over budget. Total expenses for April were \$380,482. Truro has a YTD net loss of \$98,343, but has not yet had to access its line of credit loan for cash flow. The Vestry is grateful to our faithful staff for holding down expenses, to our congregation for its faithful giving and to our Lord for His provision for all our needs.

A Call to Truro to Pray & Fast

Please join us as we come together as a church family and commit to pray and fast on Thursdays May 19th–June 10th as the Commonwealth of Virginia Supreme Court deliberates the Episcopal Church appeal of our case. We expect we may have a ruling from the Supreme Court on Friday, June 11th (although this is subject to change). You are encouraged, as you are able, to fast at least one meal every Thursday and intercede in prayer. To help guide your prayers, here is a prayer that I will be using in my prayer time:

O Lord Jesus Christ, who built your Church upon the rock of the Apostles, that even the gates of hell cannot prevail against it: Be merciful to the churches of this land, give us the grace of repentance so that our hearts turn to you alone, and especially we pray for our own Church, Truro Parish, that we would have a single heart for You. Make our worship pleasing to your sight, sweeten our fellowship with tender hearts toward one another, unite us in a common vision and purpose, grant us favor in the deliberations of the Virginia Supreme Court, and most of all, make us instruments of your peace and truth in a country in need of a revival of goodness and light. We ask this in Jesus Name. Amen.

Victory Thru Jesus Mini-Camps on the Farm

Truro youth, ages 13 to 21, are invited to attend a three-day mini-camp this summer on Charles and Kathy Strother's farm in Delaplane, Virginia, about an hour west of Truro Church. The mini-camps are designed for youth who want to deepen their relationship with Jesus and develop a greater understanding of the role of the Holy Spirit in their lives.

The mini-camps will be held June 23–26, July 14–17 and August 11–14. Campers arrive from 6:30 to 7:00 on Wednesday evening and join in a worship gathering at 8:00 pm; camp concludes with evening worship on Saturday night. A maximum of 15 campers can attend each session.

The cost is \$50, plus campers bring their own food for breakfast, lunch and snacks. Dinner is provided. All campers stay with chaperones in the Victory Thru Jesus Retreat House on the 500-acre farm. Each day will include a morning teaching session, afternoon fun on the farm and evening worship in the renovated Red Barn praise and worship center.

The Fearings from Church of the Holy Spirit will help lead the June session; Donna McCabe from Global Awakening School of Supernatural Ministry will speak in July, and team members from Truro's Brazil 2010 will minister and share their experiences at the July 17 closing worship. August speakers will be announced later.
