I asked to post this article because God has given me the opportunity to go on a trip to develop into an effective spiritual leader through a summer project run by Campus Crusade for Christ (it's a Christian college ministry). This project is called The Edge, and one of the responsibilities that participants of the Edge have is to raise support money so they can go on the trip. But before I talk more about that, let me tell you about the Edge and why it has such significance to me.

The Edge is a unique three week summer project held in Fort Collins, Colorado; which is designed to equip all of us on the project to take others deeper in their faith. Library Check Out 101

In the recently completed Library inventory we found that 110 books had disappeared in the last two years. They were not checked out, but they were missing from the shelves.

A few people have confessed to me that they sometimes borrow books knowing that they’ll get them back soon and hoping they won’t be missed. Other people don’t know how to check out the books.

We keep records of how many books are checked out. We use the cards to note how many times a book has been checked out in the last five years. We remove books from the

collection that haven’t been read recently.

When you check out a book, simply fill out the card that is located in the pocket at the back of the book with the due date (one month later), your first and last name, and your phone number. Place that card in the closest check out box. These boxes are located in Common Grounds, in the Reception Room (for reference books), at the computer station outside of Room 10, and at the Young Adult and Children’s locations. Librarians will take the cards out of the boxes and file them until the book is returned. The librarian then replaces

the card and returns the book to the proper place on the shelves.

There are no fines for overdue books. But we only have shelf space for one copy of most books. If you have a book languishing on your shelves, no one else can read it. Please help keep our books circulating by checking them out properly and returning them promptly.
