Tim and Ros Mayfield—Already here, but not yet!



Today we introduce to our community The Rev'd Tim Mayfield and his wife Ros. Tim and Ros come to us from St. Mark's Battersea in London where Tim served on staff. We plan to fully welcome them on Sunday, September 5, since they are tying up loose ends this summer.

Listening to Tim and Ros tell their story while we sat around tables in the North Street Panera's, over and over again I heard stories of how God surprises our timetables with His perfect timing.

Born in Battersea, London, Tim had a profound experience of meeting Christ while on a visit to St. Algates in Oxford in 1981. This visit led him to join the community at Holy Trinity Brompton in London. As he grew in Christ, he wanted to serve in any way he could, so he started as their sexton, but in due time became their worship leader and was part of the pioneering team that started the Alpha Course at HTB.

Tim received his theological training at Ridley Theological College in Oxford and was ordained to the priesthood in 1999. Since then, he has served as member of the clergy staff at St. Mark's, back in his own neighborhood of Battersea. There he met his wife Ros and they married in 2007.

Ros was born in Kent, England, though was actually baptized in the Episcopal Church when her father was a member of the choir in the American (Episcopal) Church in London. When she was twelve she attended Spring Harvest, a major annual Christian outreach to youth. "Looking back it was the start date of being overwhelmed by God's unique love for me," Ros says of her early experience with Christ. Later she would work for the Rev'd David Watson with the youth at St. Michael le Belfrey in York, before becoming a journalist and going to work for the BBC in London. In London, she joined the community at St. Mark's where she met Tim while leading an Alpha Course small group. Perfect timing!

At St. Mark's they ministered together in the Alpha Course, with a special emphasis to the broken and marginalized. "I've learned to be excited to see what God has for us to do," Tim says, "not according to my plan and time table but just to be patient for God, wait for God to show me."

"We know God has called us here, Tim says. "We are excited about finding out what God has for us to do here." Welcome Tim and Ros!

Vestry Highlights

The June 15th Vestry meeting began with worship and prayer.

The Vestry approved the appointment of the following persons as Chairs of the respective Vestry Committees: Emily Wang—Audit Committee; June Burton—Buildings & Grounds Committee; Bill Bixler—Home Church and Small Group Committee; Jim Wilkinson—Organ Committee; Allen Thompson—Personnel Committee; and Jim Robb—Stewardship Committee. Kekelwa Nyaywa-Dall and Jim Cantwell were appointed members of the Outreach Policy Group. The Vestry also approved Robert ("Chip") Wedan as a member of the Finance Committee for a three year term.

The Vestry received a briefing concerning the three Vestry retreats last year which explained why we decided we needed to codify the Vestry governance method in the form of written policies that focus more on accomplishing the vision of Truro. After which, the Vestry voted on the steps to be taken by the July meeting to plan for the transition to a new "governance through policies" model. Because the Vestry meeting was held a week early, there was no financial report.

The Vestry received a briefing from Truro's chancellor, Bob Dilling, and its litigation counsel, George Peterson on the recent ruling of the Virginia Supreme Court concerning Truro's property. The Vestry appointed three Ad Hoc Task Forces to deal with various issues raised by this decision.
