Marriage And Family Moment

Some call the brief, intense feelings in adolescence “puppy love.” Some say that love is found in the pages of a romance novel. Others see love in the romantic interludes of a movie. All of these are glimpses of romance and good feelings, but is there a love that lasts a lifetime?

Love is real, and it can last a lifetime. But love isn't the pleasures we find in things or food. Love isn't feelings of attraction stirred when we first meet someone. Love isn't primarily feelings at all.

Love is a choice that we make to do or not to do; love is an action that we take toward someone. As the Bible commands: “Love with deeds.” How does love act? Love is patient; it waits for someone to change, for someone to get ready, for God to clarify the way. Love is kind; it cares for another in the daily grit and grind of life, being considerate and doing what needs to be done. Love is secure; it behaves in ways that promote trust and prevent jealousy, bragging, and arrogance. It chooses not to act in ways that cause insecurity such as withholding information, acting secretly or dishonestly, or isolating emotionally, verbally, or physically. Love one another as Christ has loved us.

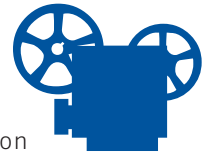
