Theology for the whole people of God



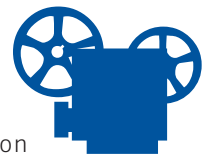

Prayer for the Persecuted Church

The Linfen Church Network in China has 50,000 members, and its six-story headquarters building was confiscated by the Chinese government in September 2009. Military police were set to guard it and prevent the church members from entering. Soon afterwards, five Linfen pastors were given long prison sentences and another five sentenced to "re-education through labor." In March of this year, Linfen city officials announced that the church building would soon be destroyed by the Chinese government. Linfen church members are calling on churches around the world to pray. You are invited to pray for Linfen Church and other persecuted Christians around the world on Monday, July 12, at 7:00 pm, in Truro's Conference Room.
