## What is Family Ministry?

Family Ministry is an umbrella for ministry to every age group from infant to young adult and ministry to parents. This includes KidZone, the Upper Room Youth Ministry, Young Adults, Alpha, Marriage and Parents. The shift to Family Ministry was designed to integrate these programs into one overarching cradle to grave discipleship model. Each of these ministries within Family Ministry

meets the age-appropriate needs of those in the ministry while keeping in mind the big picture focus of the Family Ministry. We are no longer silos but partners, stepping stones along the discipleship path.

Family Ministry also seeks to support and undergird the home and family, whether it is a traditional family, stepfamily, single-parent family, etc. The focus here is to resource the parents to be the primary disciplers of their

children. This is the biblical model spelled out in Deuteronomy 6:4-9: *Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates.* In an age where the challenges for parents are increasing, the church must support and teach parents how to disciple their children.

Finally, Family Ministry is a church wide ministry. We are the Family of God. When each infant, child, teen or adult is baptized into our community of

faith, the congregation is asked this question: *Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ?* And our response is an enthusiastic: *We will.* The church has a responsibility to its members to support those entering into the community. The Church must be the hands and feet of Christ to its children, youth and young adults.



Every member of Truro can and should be involved in Family Ministry because every Christian is responsible for passing on the faith handed down from the saints. How can you help? We need teachers for preschoolers through young adults, small group leaders, occasional event chaperons, food preparers, a/v help, graphic design support, event planning, curriculum researchers, prayer partners, greeters, musicians,

and more. Most importantly, every person in this church can speak into the life of a child, youth or young adult in a meaningful way.

Family Ministry is a commitment on behalf of the church to disciple every individual in every age group and to bring them into the community of faith as an equal member. It is then that barrier of age segregation falls and we truly become the Family of God.

We will be holding meetings on Friday, September 4, from 7–9 pm and Saturday, September 5, from 9 am–1 pm for those interested in learning more about and getting involved with the Upper Room Youth Ministry. ## Love The World Fellowship *by Jack Maier*

The Love The World Fellowship (LWF) Service on Sunday, August 9, 2009 at Truro Church was treated to a special lunch consisting of breaded chicken, stuffing, vegetables and four different green salads prepared by Brion's Grille, (10621 Braddock Road, Fairfax, VA).

In mid July while I was having dinner at Brion's Grille, the owner, Brion Sumser asked me what was happening at Truro Church so I gave him a short description of our Outreach efforts with LWF. He hesitated a moment and responded, "I want to be part of that". Having known Brion for over 15 years, I knew he was serious and invited him to the next LWF gathering. He arrived at 1 pm as our guests were entering the Undercroft to start lunch so he was able to see how the meals were prepared and distributed, and to witness the guests gratitude.

Brion was moved by our "Radical Hospitality" and said he would provide a complete meal once a month. I responded by telling Brion that LWF guests numbered approximately 300 people and that was a sizable commitment. He said "this is not about money"—WOW!!

I mentioned to Brion that from time to time I have heard from various Truro parishioners "why don't LWF guests change, get jobs, etc. etc.?" I was reminded of Munny Yates response to those questions which was "I am not here to change them but to show God's love, grace, and mercy, and any resultant change in their lives is not caused by me, but that of the Holy Spirit". I can add a postscript to that; the change absolutely does take place when we reach out to the homeless; but the change is not in the LWF guests but rather in those who reach out to help them.

## In Memory Of Peter Hill

I first met Peter Hill in the spring of 1996. I had recently volunteered as a Jr High Youth Leader at Truro and was soon to serve with Pete (as he wanted to be known as Pete) in many different areas. Some of these areas included Sunday School teacher, leader at Rockbridge Jr High camp, and Sunday night youth group volunteer.



Having seen Pete in action in all of these venues gave me a chance to see him in circumstances that vividly showed his love of Christ. I often wondered how a man who was so funny in so many ways could also be so serious about what he believed. Although I was older than Pete, I learned a lot from being around him in the seven or eight years we served together. I believe the best way to show this would be to share some of my recollections of these times.

While teaching Sunday School, Pete would always keep in mind an admonition from Will Cravens (our Truro Church youth leader) that “You do not have the right to bore the kids”. Taking this to heart, Pete could make the simplest Bible stories come alive with their relevance to current times and also show his passion about the scriptures. This was something that I tried to emulate later on as a Sunday School teacher when Pete passed the baton to me.

Pete was at his best, however when it came to interacting with others. I remember with a smile on my face the times at Rockbridge when a group of Jr High boys would try to dunk Pete in the pool. Four or five boys would gather around Pete while playing pool volleyball and attempt to dunk him. It was so funny to see these boys hanging on Pete's arms, neck, and legs trying to pull him under the water. He would simply move his arms in a circle and start walking away and the boys would fall off in to the water. None of them would get hurt and Pete never got dunked so everyone had a good time. Many of the kids held Pete in awe because this gentle giant of a man allowed them to play and have fun without him getting angry. In youth group, his talent for playing games was evident. Whether it was the “egg toss” (bring clothes to get messy) or “water balloon night” (bring clothes to get wet in), or seeing who could eat a can of spam the fastest (bring a strong stomach), Pete was always in the middle of things. When we finished having fun, this same Pete could set the kids down and teach a lesson that was designed to make them think about their relationship with Christ. It was amazing to see this man at one moment being so much fun and only a few moments later to be teaching the gospel in a serious manner.

I would be remiss in talking about Pete if I did not also include the other youth leaders, parents, clergy, coworkers, and family members that I have known over the last thirteen years since I met him. I can honestly say that I never heard a negative word from any of these people about Pete. And most importantly, I could see at his funeral the outpouring of love from his family and closest friends in their stories about him. From the first time I heard about Maritza (his wife), I knew she was the love of his life. Later when he had his two children (Joshua and Ariana), I could see his love for them weekly at church as his family usually sat in front of my wife and me. If his children cried, he would gently pick them up and take them to the back of the sanctuary and they would come back calm and smiling. It was a joy seeing this man that I knew mostly as a youth leader become a good husband and father.

Pete, thank you for the love of Christ that you showed each one of us in your life. We miss you and we love you and we look forward to seeing you again in heaven. May the Lord grant us the grace to live a life of love as described in I Corinthians: 13: 1–13 as you did.

## God's Best: Serve One Another

This morning I am preaching on the husband/wife relationship—God's best. God's best is that a husband and wife follow Christ's example and serve one another. One of the best tools for serving each other is to understand and apply the five love languages. Author and counselor, Gary Chapman, suggests five primary love languages: affirming words, loving acts, gifts, quality time and touch. The whole world looks brighter when we feel loved. Most of us have a primary and a secondary way that we feel loved. We usually fail to communicate love if we do so through the language that makes us feel loved. We effectively communicate love when we do so through the language that makes our partner feel loved.

**Affirming words:** you look great! I love you. You have a great sense of humor! I really enjoyed our dinner. Thank you for... Do you have enough gas in your car? Take an umbrella, it might rain. Those who feel loved through words enjoy receiving cards and letters of affirmation and often give the same.

**Loving acts:** buying groceries and everything related to meal preparation and cleanup, completing the laundry, maintaining the house or yard or cars, taking care of children or anything that needs to be done at home. Note that a woman's need for loving acts tends to go up after the birth of a child.

**Gifts:** for women it may be chocolate, jewelry, clothes or flowers. For men, it may be tools, guns or a truck. The gift may be the physical presence of another, especially in a difficult time.

**Quality time:** one on one time where each is the primary focus of the other. Dating and engaged couples tend to be great at this, but many marriages fail to make it a priority. Note that it does not include children or other adults.

**Physical touch:** touch is essential to life. Most of us desire and need to be touched caringly. This includes sex in marriage. Note that a woman's need for physical touch from her husband tends to decrease after the birth of a child.
