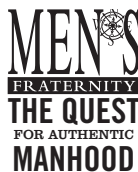

Daughters of the King Preparation Class

The Daughters of the King (DOK), established in 1885, is a lay Order for women who are communicants of churches in the Historic Episcopate. Every Daughter pledges herself to a lifelong program of daily prayer, service, and personal evangelism, dedicated to the extension of Christ's kingdom and to the strengthening of the spiritual life of the parish. The emblem of the Order is in the form of a modified Greek fleury cross inscribed in Latin, "Magnanimiter Crucem Sustine," the watchword of the Order, meaning "With heart, mind, spirit uphold and bear the cross." At the base of the cross are the letters "FHS", initials that stand for the motto of the Order, "For His Sake... I am but one, but I am one. I cannot do everything, but I can do something. What I can do, I ought to do. What I ought to do, by the grace of God I will do. Lord, what will you have me do?" Members wear this cross daily as an outward and visible sign that we cannot live a day without Christ in our lives.
