## Giving Thankfully *by Lawson Sperapani*

*The following article was originally published in "Moody" magazine Jan./Feb. 2001 as a part of "Closer to Him: How Do real People Find Ways to Draw Nearer to God?" It has been adapted for the TFN and features Ed Prichard, a long-time member of Truro.*

One night in 1972 Ed Prichard awoke, sensing that God wanted him to give money to a preacher who ministered to hippies. Ed asked, "How much, Lord?" then wrote a check for \$182. When Ed gave the preacher the check, the man smiled and thanked him.

Only later did he tell Ed that he had needed exactly \$180 to pay his rent the next day.

Although not many gifts are that dramatic, over the years Ed, who died in 2000 at age 80, had the joy of giving money, time, and talent to many people. "As the Lord blesses me with resources, I like to use them in a way I think the Lord would approve," said Ed, a land-use

attorney and the former mayor of Fairfax.



"Ed is a great example of a generous Christian man," says John Keith, former president of the Virginia Bar Association. "He has mentored young lawyers. And he's given countless hours of topnotch, free legal work to the church and those who are in need." That generosity has extended to such acts as opening his home to a pastor in need, bestowing money on a poor widow, and giving land to a fledgling university (GMU).

In the mid-'50s, Ed established a separated bank account for "the Lord's money" and began making monthly deposits. "At first the law practice didn't pay much," he said, "but as I made more, I gave more than a tithe."

"For most of his life, my father gave away about 15 percent of his income," says The Rev. Bob Prichard, a professor at Virginia Theological Seminary. "He used to give about half to the

church and half to civic causes. Then in the early '70s, as my father regarded his faith with a new personal emphasis, he had a fundamental realignment of giving strategies. More and more of his gifts went to the church and church-related ministries."

According to his son, Ed gave out of thanksgiving. "Like many of his generation, my father grew up in a home with few resources. He was just extraordinarily thankful for what the Lord had given him."

The Missions Day will begin at 8:30 am with registration, followed by a time of worship and plenary session, during which experienced AGMP missionaries will present on a variety of topics that address many key aspects of missions. Following the plenary session, and again following lunch, we will be offering five workshops sessions that will be given simultaneously.

- The “Youth in Missions” workshop will focus on how to engage youth in mission and how to implement a missionary strategy in student ministry.

## Report on Brazil 2007

In July 2007, Charles and Kathy Strother took a group of young people on the 2007 Youth Power Invasion in Sao Paulo, Brazil. Amy Fleming was a part of that team, and the experience changed her life. Below, in her own words, are some highlights of what she learned when she was in Brazil about:

**God**—God is faithful. Even if I had no idea what I was doing, God was there.

**Jesus’ power to heal**—When you pray for someone to be healed, it happens. Many times we pray with empty expectations that God will heal this or alleviate that, but we don’t think it will happen. Jesus died for us to have life, and live it to the full. The same power that conquered the grave lives in us as followers of Christ. Why wouldn’t Christ’s healing power still be available to those who are hurting?

**God’s love and compassion**—abounds. There are no boundaries. This trip taught me

to love everyone through Jesus’ eyes. God cares for all, and we are to do the same—no matter what they’ve done or been through.

**God’s call on my life**—My life was changed through this experience. I experienced God in a way I couldn’t fathom. My life is my King’s and I have been called to do HIS work and not my own. Everyone on my trip received a call, some to be missionaries, others to pastor churches, and still others to go to the streets and evangelize.

**Who I am in Christ**—Just because I am young doesn’t mean that I am not a part of the body or that Christ can’t use me—but on the contrary that God chooses those who think they are weakest to do His work. I am part of an incredible body who needs me, and whom I need.

**God’s willingness to use anyone**—God uses those who are willing, and He WILL use you. I was 17 and never had seen a healing or miracle and daily, I was praying for tumors and blind eyes and paralysis. God used me to reach His people. YOU are not your own—so stop worrying and rely on the Savior to do His work through you.

## Brazil 2010— Going Deeper with God

A team of Truro young adults and teens will travel to Curitiba, Brazil, next summer during the first two weeks of July to serve as the prayer ministry team—alongside Brazilian translators/prayer partners—for a series of healing services. Joining with others from around the U.S. as part of Global Awakening’s Youth Power Invasion, our group will study prayer and healing ministry in the mornings and then practice what they’ve learned in the evenings at churches throughout Curitiba as people come forward to receive prayer.

This mission trip is open to spiritually mature youth and young adults (13-29) who want to go deeper with God and learn how to co-labor with Jesus in bringing healing and encouragement to hurting people. It’s an adventure that will draw participants closer to the Lord, expand their understanding of worship, build their faith, call forth their gifts and increase their compassion for others.

Brazil 2010 is a chance to go beyond hearing about miracles to being part of them. God wants to use each of us to minister to others and demonstrate His love and compassion. This is a wonderful opportunity to experience His faithfulness. Don’t miss it!

Briefings for Young Adults to be announced at a later date. The team will begin forming in December and start fundraising during Advent. All members should be identified in January to begin team training and complete paperwork in April. Expected cost of the trip is about \$2800, plus visa and inoculations.

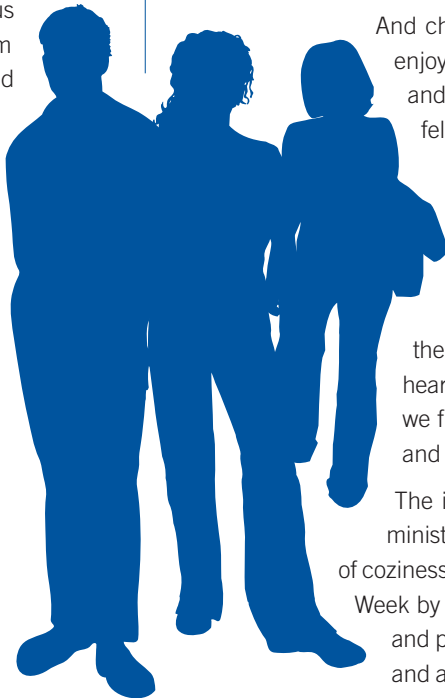

In this study we will look at Biblically-based steps to spiritual growth and renewal for those dealing with spiritual coldness, bad habits, guilt and shame, or any other attitude or behavior that holds us back from growing in God's grace and truth and power.
