Guided Through Prayer *by Arne Christenson*

When I was young, I was once with the son of a prominent and wealthy family, and one of my friends, not always known for his social grace, asked him abruptly, "What's it like to have a dad who's really rich?" He did not seem surprised by the question and simply responded, "We never think of it as our money; we're just taking care of it for the next generation."

I have often thought of that answer in relation to stewardship. Joyful giving begins with a simple thought: it's not our money; we're just taking care of what we have received. For that reason, as we pray about giving we should ask a simple question: "God, what do you want me to do with your money?"

God will sometimes answer that prayer through Scripture. My wife Debra and I have found the scriptural principle of tithing to be a wonderful foundation for giving. It not only leads you to set aside the first ten percent of what you

receive; it reminds you regularly that everything belongs to God.

God will sometimes respond to that prayer with a very specific answer. Fourteen years ago, Debra and I were praying about what to give to a specific ministry. The work was important to us, we felt we should increase our giving, and we prayed and decided together to give a specific amount, a stretch for us at the time. When we met with a leader of the ministry, he prayed with us and then asked us to consider a gift—suggesting the exact amount Debra and I had already felt led to give.

God will sometimes guide us through prayer to new priorities for our giving. Debra and I are thankful that Truro constantly seeks God's guidance in how to respond to the changing needs of our community and the world. As we have given to Truro, we have seen God use our church powerfully in a variety of ways

over the years: international missions, Christian education, the needs of the homeless.

Paul writes that we should never give reluctantly or under compulsion, "for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Cor 9:7). As we pray and are guided by God, we will not only find that our giving grows and has purpose and direction. We will also find that it is one of the greatest joys of our life.

Dear Friends In Christ At Truro,

I want to thank the many of you who have been so faithful in praying for and encouraging me this past summer. 2. Continued daily inward renewing by the Holy Spirit (see 2 Cor 4:16) so that Christ would shine forth more brightly in my life.
3. Wisdom in work and ministry priorities—we are more conscious than ever that we need to live each day in light of eternity.

Journey To Jerusalem FAQ

Q: What is the Journey to Jerusalem?

A: The Journey to Jerusalem is an opportunity for confirmed students in 7th-12th grade to travel to Jerusalem in order to learn more about their own faith. Students will deepen their understanding of Christian history and its Jewish Roots, have the opportunity to engage in Interfaith Dialogue and learn valuable leadership skills.

Q: What will the students do in Jerusalem?

A: The students will participate in a Shoresh Tour that will take them through Jerusalem, to the Mount of Olives and Gethsemane, the Holocaust Museum, and onto the Judean Desert and the Dead Sea. In addition they will be able to engage in interfaith dialogue with Jewish and Muslim peers.

Q: When will we go and where will we be staying?

A: We will leave December 26th and return January 2nd. We will be staying at Christ Church Guesthouse in Jerusalem.
